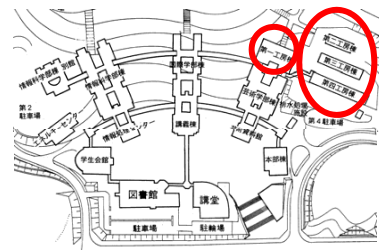


Campus Map

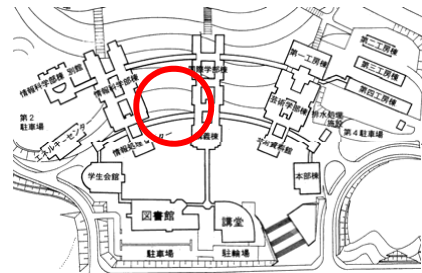
Ateliers for stone curving, metal craft, wood curving support students' creative urges.
